The evening will allow the Force's best to shine and be acknowledged for their professional excellence and dedication.

Nominated by commanders only, the premier award of the night, the **NSW Rotary Police Officer of the Year**, is chosen from the winners of these categories:

- Metropolitan Field Operations Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Metropolitan Field Operations Commands
- Regional NSW Field Operations Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Regional Field Operations Commands
- Investigations and Counter Terrorism Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Investigations and Counter Terrorism Commands
- Specialist Support Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Specialist Support Commands
- Corporate Services Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Corporate Services Commands

The award in the Hawkesbury LAC is named in memory of **Detective Inspector Bryson Anderson**, who was murdered whilst on duty in December, 2012.










