#### Introduction.

The Rotary Club of Windsor established the Youth Foundation Trust in 1996. Its intention is to financially assist youth who LIVE or ATTEND SCHOOL within the Hawkesbury City Council boundaries and meet the following requirements. Please note age requirements, where noted, for some categories.

Application for grants for assistance, to a maximum of \$1200, may be made under five categories: -

- 1. Welfare or advancement of life of physically or mentally challenged young people aged from 6 to 18 years.
- 2. Education of any person from age 11 to the completion of secondary schooling.
- 3. The pursuit of excellence in amateur sport for any young person aged 12 to 21.
- 4. Education of persons from 14 to 21 years of age, in cultural activities which could be of benefit to our local community.
- 5. Any pursuit of youth, deemed by the board of trustees which corresponds with the spirit and ideals of the Rotary movement.

Applications are invited for these awards. The total assistance available for 2016 is approximately \$10,000, which may be allocated as individual grants not exceeding \$1200, as determined by the Trustees.

The Trustees are not bound to make an award should they feel that no suitable applications have been received. All applications will be judged on their merit by the Trustees and their decision is final.

Applications without supporting documentation will not be included in the review process for allocating grants.
